Over \$1.7 Million Approved for Community Investment by the EDT

SIX NATIONS OF THE GRAND RIVER, ON – December 8, 2017 – The Six Nations of the Grand River Economic Development Trust (EDT) is excited to announce the 2018 Community Investment recipients. This year, the EDT reviewed 17 applications with a total request of just over \$8 million. From these applications, 3 Grassroots and 6 General applicants were approved for a total community investment of \$1,729,381.53.

The EDT is made possible through annual distributions of surplus profits by the Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC). Since the creation of the EDT, just over \$6.7 million has been invested into the Six Nations Community for the collective benefit of its members; with \$3.5 million invested in 2016, \$1.4 million in 2017 and \$1.7 million approved for investment in 2018.

“The Economic Development Trust is an application based community investments fund,” said Rachel Martin, Chair of the EDT. “Trustees review applications based on their merit, community impact and ability to address goals outlined in the Community Plan.”



Approved 2018 recipients include: SONICS-CKRZ, Six Nations Public Works, Kawenni:io Private School, Ganohkwasra, Six Nations Minor Lacrosse, Six Nations Police, Grand River Pow Wow, Two Row on the Grand, and Six Nations Minor Ball. The majority of 2018 Community Investment funds (\$1,200,000) will go towards the extension of the waterline to the Oneida Business Park, extending the line two concessions from Onondaga Rd to just before Hwy 6 on Fourth Line. This will provide 142 homes with the opportunity to connect to the watermain and includes the installation of 40 new fire hydrants.

The Six Nations of the Grand River Economic Development Trust (EDT) slated just over \$1.7M to be invested in the community in 2018. These funds were made possible by the Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation's (SNGRDC) net-free cash flow for all periods prior to March 31, 2017. A total of 9 projects have been approved for 2018 Community Investment by the EDT, in the areas outlined in the Comprehensive Community Plan, Community Needs and Priorities, the and the EDT Distribution Guidelines.
