



A6N TO CONSTRUCT WATERLINE

A6N is a Joint Venture between Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (51% ownership) and Aecon Group Inc. (49% ownership). The company performs utility related work such as right-of-way clearing, restoration, meter hazard avoidance program, out-of-date meter replacement program, hydro vacuuming, trenching, excavation, directional drilling, restoration of hard and soft surfaces, brush & tree clearing and traffic control. Throughout the last three years, A6N has progressively evolved into a strong example of how corporate Canada and First Nations can work closely together for the benefit of the community.

A6N will be constructing Phase One of the Waterline extension.

Last year, the EDT approved \$1,200,000 for the installation of the waterline to Oneida Business Park. The extension will provide 142 homes with the opportunity to connect to the watermain and get off contaminated well systems.

Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC) currently manages Six Nations' economic interest in 14 renewable energy projects and numerous economic development opportunities, in and around the Six Nations territory.



One of our newest green energy projects, Nanticoke Solar LP, has recently begun construction to convert the former Nanticoke Generation Station's coal yard and adjacent properties into a 44 MW ground mount solar installation. The project will consist of approximately 190,000 solar photovoltaic panels on four parcels of land. The project is in partnership with Ontario Power Generation (OPG) and Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC).

A job fair was held at Grand River Employment and Training (GREAT) on Tuesday, April 3rd, 2018 with the project's contractors - PCL Construction. Over 45 community members attended the job fair. Any additional applicants are encouraged to register at GREAT.

The Six Nations of the Grand River Economic Development Trust (EDT) is fueled annually by surplus profits generated by the Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC). Each year, trustees receive and score completed application. In 2018, the EDT reviewed 17 applications and approved nine for community investment (six General and three Grassroots).

★ Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC), Elephant Thoughts, and the Independent Electrical Systems Operator (IESO) worked together to host a 2-day interactive workshop to over 200 Grade 4 & 5 students at local elementary schools on Six Nations. The interactive workshop was delivered at Emily C. General School, Oliver M. Smith School, Jamieson School and I.L Thomas Schools in early April in celebration of Earth Day.

Youth were engaged in fun, hands-on activities to help understand how electricity is generated, transmitted, and distributed, while building self-confidence, problem solving and critical thinking skills. Students investigated energy conservation and a "safety first" approach when it comes to using and being around electricity.

In addition to the in-class workshops, SNGRDC with help from the Community Collaborators Program hosted four Public Energy Nights with the goal to have families come learn about the importance of renewable energy and provide an opportunity for parents to engage with their children in an academic setting.

SNGRDC would like to thank IESO and the SNGRDC Community Collaborators for their support in the Energy in Schools Program and we look forward to delivering the same programming next year.
