ONEIDA ENERGY STORAGE FACILITY REACHES COMMERCIAL OPERATION

On May 7, 2025, it was announced that the Oneida Energy Storage Project ("Oneida"), a 250MW/1,000MWh battery storage facility located in Haldimand County, has commenced commercial operations. The project was completed ahead of schedule and under budget and is the largest battery energy storage facility in operation in Canada. The facility is comprised of 278 battery packs and is capable of a 4-hour discharge, which is enough energy to power a city the size of Oshawa for an hour. Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation was a foundational partner in this project alongside NRStor Inc., and holds a 10% equity stake in the project.

The construction of the project was largely undertaken by Aecon-Six Nations (A6N), a general partnership between SNGRDC and Aecon with a majority-Indigenous workforce. Oneida Energy provided employment to 40 A6N employees during peak construction. Oneida will continue to provide economic benefits for Six Nations, including community investment and surplus profits that will be reinvested into the community through the Six Nations of the Grand River Economic Development Trust.



10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY

On May 1, 2025, SNGRDC celebrated its official tenth anniversary with a catered breakfast and cake for our team. President & CEO Matt Jamieson addressed Team Members, expressing his gratitude for their hard work and dedication over the past decade. He also shared our vision for the next ten years and beyond, highlighting the continued growth and success ahead.



ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS 2024 SUCCESSES

SNGRDC held its Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, May 21, 2025, to review last year's 2024 financial audit and statements for both SNGRDC and the Economic Development Trust (EDT). Past EDT recipients were invited to share the impact that the EDT has had on their organizations, including Ganohkwasra Family Assault Support Services and Two Row on the Grand.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2024 INCLUDE:

- **\$2,334,690** transferred to Six Nations Elected Council (SNEC) to be used to address Community Plan priorities, by way of EDT annual transfer.
- **\$61,500** raised by the Community Collaborators program to fund Community Awareness BBQ, School Book Donations, and Fall Festival.
- **\$583,672** transferred to EDT to be used for investment in community priorities outside of SNEC departments.
- **\$192,898** given to local community organizations through funding from the Oneida Energy Storage Project
- Generated **\$36,400,000** in Direct Economic Impact for the Six Nations community (i.e. payroll, local vendor spending, etc.)
- **\$200,000** in sponsorships given by Six Nations Bingo the Six Nations Gaming Commission to support minor sports and local elementary schools.

SNGRDC CONTINUES TO EXPAND PARTNERSHIP PORTFOLIO

SNGRDC is excited to announce the formation of five new partnerships with reputable companies across North America to perform a variety of services:



Brock Canada Inc., a leading provider of multi-craft specialty services across North America, has launched a Joint Venture (JV) with SNGRDC, with SNGRDC holding a majority interest of 50.1%. The JV will undertake contracts for development projects in Southern Ontario.



CiveoSix, a limited partnership between Civeo Corporation and SNGRDC will deliver hospitality, food services, janitorial, and property maintenance services.



VersaPile Inc., a Manitoba-based helical pile contractor, has partnered with SNGRDC to perform work related to the construction of renewable energy infrastructure in Southern Ontario.



Sterling Crane, a crane rental and service company based in Edmonton, AB, and SNGRDC have signed an agreement in which SNGRDC will present contract opportunities to Sterling Crane and SNGRDC will receive a percentage of profit for contracts completed.



MSS Ltd., an Indigenous-led procurement company based in the Northwest Territories, has formed a Joint Venture (JV) with SNGRDC, with SNGRDC holding a majority interest of 51%. The JV will serve as a platform to supply a range of products, including healthcare supplies and equipment, occupational health and safety products, office and institutional furniture, and more.

These partnerships will diversify SNGRDC's portfolio, grow our asset base, and will also provide additional sources of revenue for the company. These revenues in turn allow SNGRDC to reinvest more surplus profits into the Six Nations community through the Economic Development Trust. Each partnership has stipulated the prioritization of Indigenous procurement, partnership, and employment.

Did you know? SNGRDC's current portfolio has a total participation of 2.4GW of green energy, enough to provide electricity to homes in a town the size of Milton for one year.

From January - March 2025, SNGRDC's wind and solar sites resulted in a greenhouse gas reduction of approximately 13,600 tonnes, which is equivalent to:


