SNGRDC CONTINUES TO EXPAND PARTNERSHIP PORTFOLIO

SNGRDC is excited to announce the addition of two new partnerships to our portfolio



Tulloch, an Ontario-based multidisciplinary consulting engineering firm, and SNGRDC have agreed to the formation of a joint venture to provide engineering services for current and future development projects in Southern Ontario.



Maple Leaf Matting, a Calgary-based company providing environmental access matting solutions, and SNGRDC have signed an agreement that will see SNGRDC receive a share of profits from Maple Leaf Matting projects in Southern and Southwestern Ontario.

These partnerships will diversify SNGRDC's portfolio while providing additional sources of revenue for the company. These revenues in turn allow SNGRDC to reinvest more surplus profits into the Six Nations community through the Economic Development Trust. Furthermore, each partnership has stipulated the prioritization of Indigenous procurement, partnership, and employment wherever possible.
